WHAT IS JESUS WORTH TO YOU?

Philippians 3:3-11

True believers, all of the true "circumcision," have three common characteristics that prove their standing before God:

- 1. We worship in the Spirit of God.
- 2. We boast in Christ Jesus.
- 3. We have no confidence in the flesh.

2. TIME FOR HONEST SELF-ASSESSMENT v. 4

GRACE VS. WORKS: It is easy to place more emphasis on religious effort—works (*confidence in the flesh*)—than on internal faith, but God sees the attitude of our hearts.

- To prove his point, Paul challenged any false teachers to a fleshly credentials "showdown."
- Paul lists seven qualifications of a full-blooded Jew.
- Four of these were from heredity or by birth, three were by choice or personal conviction. BUT THEY WERE NOT SUFFICIENT TO GET HIM INTO HEAVEN!

3. PAUL'S WORTHLESS CREDENTIALS v. 5-6

- 1. Circumcised on the eighth day.
- 2. Of the tribe of Benjamin.
- 3. Of the people of Israel. (NRSV)
- 4. A Hebrew born of Hebrews.
- 5. Concerning the law, a Pharisee.
- 6. As to zeal, a persecutor of the church.
- 7. As to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Wow . . . nice résumé of accomplishments and heritage!

4. THE BIG BUT v. 7

SPIRITUAL ACCOUNTING: IT WAS ALL A BUNCH OF JUNK.

- Paul used an accounting metaphor with a gains and loss column. "GAINS" is plural, referring to individual items.
- "LOSS" is singular, indicating that all the "GAINS" are no longer worth being listed separately, but come under a single category: "LOSS."
- Paul compared **ALL HIS DOCTORATES IN JUDAISM** to the joy of knowing Jesus as Lord, and then filled his garbage cans with his Jewish credentials.

5. REAL VALUE v. 8

When Paul said "all things," he was referring to any type of credential or honor or acclaim that someone might try to use in order to gain favor with God.

- The Greek word for "knowing" here speaks of a personal, experiential, and progressive knowledge.
- When Paul considered everything he had accomplished in his life, he decided to write it off as "a loss" when compared with the greatness of knowing Christ.
- REAL VALUE: Only the one who willingly lets go of all things can truly gain Christ. LUKE 9:23-24

KNOWING CHRIST IS WORTH THE SACRIFICE.

6. WHERE ARE YOU AT? v. 9

Whether Christ returned or Paul died, Paul wanted to be "found in" Christ every moment—that is living in a vibrant, intimate, wonderful union with Christ—LOST IN HIM!

If you could, where would you choose to be

"LOST FOR A DAY"?

- A backpacker might be deep in the High Sierras.
- A baseball fan—Cooperstown, New York.

Being "found in" Jesus Christ is, paradoxically, like being lost in Him—FULLY IMMERSED IN THE EXPERIENCE OF JESUS.

7. DEATH TO LIFE! v. 10-11

When we are united with Christ by trusting in Him, we experience the power that raised Him from the dead.

- But before we can walk in newness of life, we must also die to sin.
- We can't know the victory of the Resurrection without personally applying the Crucifixion. Death to the old ways—a life lived for Him will cost you everything!
