Day 1

PRAY: Ask the Father to open your heart and understanding to His word.

READ: John 11:1–16

WRITE:

Day 2

PRAY: Ask for insight into the reading of His word today by the help of the Holy Spirit.

READ: John 11:17–57

WRITE:

What has God pressed upon your heart in the reading of these verses? _____

APPLY:

How does what you have written above directly impact your life this week in your attempt to not just hear God's word, but to walk it out? _____

Day 3

PRAY: Ask God to give you understanding to turn from every false way through His word. "How sweet are Your words to my taste, *sweeter* than honey to my mouth! Through Your precepts I get understanding; therefore I hate every false way." Psalm 119:103,104

READ: John 11:1–17

WRITE:

In v. 8 we see the disciples' concern for Jesus' safety. In v. 9, 10 Jesus responds with His commitment and confidence in God's specific timetable for His plans. How does Isaiah 55:8, 9 confirm this truth? _____

APPLY:

We also see Jesus following God's timing in John 11:4, 15 which clearly state why Jesus delayed in coming to help this beloved family. Why did He delay? How does this truth help you in waiting on God for an answer to prayer, or in taking a step of faith? _____

Day 4

PRAY: Ask for eyes to see wonderful things in God's word.

READ: John 11:18–27

WRITE:

In verses 25 and 26, who does Jesus say that He is and what will happen to those who believe in Him?

APPLY:

In 1 Cor. 15:12–19 and Romans 6:3–11, we see that the resurrection impacts our daily life here and now. Describe what this death and resurrection will look like in our everyday life according to these verses.

Day 5

PRAY: Ask God for help to incline your heart to perform His word today. “Your testimonies I have taken as a heritage forever, for they *are* the rejoicing of my heart. I have inclined my heart to perform your statutes forever, to the very end.” Psalm 119:111,112

READ: John 11:28–57

WRITE:

What was the outcome in the spoken words of Jesus, “Lazarus come forth,” in verse 43—for Lazarus, for those who saw the miracle, and for the Pharisees? (Refer to verses 45, 46, 53). _____

APPLY:

How can you respond to Jesus’ spoken word in Ephesians 2:1 and 2 Corinthians 5:17 and come forth into what Jesus calls you to in truth? _____
