Marriage – It's full of beauty but also comes with challenges! Titus 2 exhorts every married woman to love her husband. A great example of this principle lived out is found in 1 Samuel 25. Here we are introduced to Abigail who was married to a man named Nabal who was known to be “harsh and evil in his doings.” Needless to say, she’s faced head-on with the challenge to love her husband. Her wise behavior not only resulted in saving her husband and his household but she spared David from doing something reckless. Abigail’s example challenges us to navigate difficult situations in a biblical and God-honoring way so that we can become that Woman of Worth.

DAY 1

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:118. Pray that you will be careful to obey Gods word and not stray from His commands.

READ: Titus 2:3–5 and 1 Corinthians 13:1–3

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

Pause and reflect on 1 Corinthians 13:1–3. Consider that others may see great acts of faith or service and be impressed by you. But what does God see—a clanging cymbal or loveless acts of service? Take some time right now to ask the Lord to reveal if you are loving those closest to you. Be honest and write below any area that you are struggling in. Then ask the Holy Spirit to help you to walk in His love.

DAY 2

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:124. Stop and pray. Ask our merciful Lord to teach you His statutes.

READ: 1 Corinthians 13:4–8

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

1 Corinthians 13:4–8 gives us a detailed description of what love involves. Write below how you can practically live out these characteristics of love. _____

DAY 3

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:125. Start today with a prayer asking the Spirit to give you understanding so you may know God’s testimonies.

READ: 1 Samuel 25:2–19 and Proverbs 31:30

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

No doubt Abigail was in a difficult marriage that required her to walk in wisdom and choose to fear the Lord more than her unreasonable husband. From the scriptures below, share what you learned regarding the fear of the Lord and how it will help you to love difficult people.

DAY 4

PRAY: Psalm 119:127. Pray that you will have a love for God’s Word and love it above anything this world has to offer you.

READ: Genesis 2:18 and Ecclesiastes 4:9–10

APPLY:
