“Becoming a Willing Woman” “Homemaker”

As women we often find ourselves wearing many different hats. This week we'll address what it means to willingly be a “homemaker.” Homemaker is exactly what it sounds like: making a home. And to be clear it is far more than simply “staying at home.” It's about consciously making your home a place where both family and friends can encounter truth, goodness and a sense of belonging. It's about showing the love of Christ to all we come in contact with inside our home and out. Mary, the mother of Jesus, will be our Titus 2 example to follow for this lesson.

DAY 1

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:150. Begin today with a prayer asking the Lord to strengthen your choice to walk according to His Word.

READ: Titus 2:3–5, Colossians 3:22–24, and 1 Corinthians 3:10–11

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

Perhaps you're doing this lesson and have never thought of yourself as a homemaker. But in reality you are. A homemaker is so much more than cooking or doing laundry—it's making your home a sanctuary for all who come in. From the scriptures above, what do you learn that is essential to how you build your home? _____

DAY 2

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:151. Pray. Choose to stay near the Lord and walk in the truth that He reveals to you today.

READ: Psalm 101:2, Proverbs 14:1, Proverbs 24:3–4, Proverbs 31:27, and Philippians 4:11

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

It isn't having a home that makes you a homemaker—it's you in that home. After reading the verses above, what are the qualities of a godly homemaker? Which one is the Lord pressing on your heart to pattern your life after? _____

DAY 3

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:152. Pray and thank God that His Word is forever with you!

READ: Luke 1:35–56

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

Mary is for us a great example of a homemaker who has willingly surrendered herself to God's plan for her life. The verses above reveal her heart and attitude toward serving that has made her a great example for us to follow. What do you learn about her that you can apply to your role as a homemaker and to serving others in your home? _____

DAY 4

PRAY: Read Psalm 119:153. Start today with a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to help you remember all from the Word of God that you read and study.

READ: John 2:1–11 and Proverbs 31:15–22

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

As we examine Mary, we see that the quality of being a homemaker extends far beyond the walls of our home to wherever we find ourselves serving others. How are you challenged by the scriptures above to go and make an impact in both your home, and everywhere the Lord sends you?

DAY 5

PRAY: Psalm 119:154. Pray that God’s Word will not only encourage you today but revive you.

READ: Matthew 25:34–46 and Hebrews 13:16

WRITE:

After reading this passage of scripture, what did the Spirit speak to your heart? Write it here.

APPLY:

Whether you are single or married, young or old, your home matters! We live in a world that has become increasingly hostile, and people are more alone and isolated than ever before. How can you turn your home into a place of comfort and shelter for others? _____
